[Preferred Educational Partnership](#) with Concordia University Ann Arbor to provide you with a [24% Graduate Education Tuition Discount \(Online or Seated\)](#) on graduate programs in the School of Education at Concordia University Ann Arbor (CUAA) and easy accessibility to the education team.

How it works:

- Once accepted to a course or program, the tuition discount form must be filled out and submitted each academic year before the course begins.
- The discount may be utilized throughout an entire graduate degree program so long as the partnership is current. For example, the M.S. in Educational Leadership program is 32 credits, so the PEP discount offers an educational tuition benefit of over \$4,000 applied over the course of the program.
- The discount does apply to the State of Michigan State-Required Reading course. Teachers are eligible to receive over \$440 in tuition discount on this course alone in the 17-18 year.
- Courses are offered online and at the Ann Arbor campus.

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Spring 2018 graduate courses that qualify for 24% tuition discount:

State Required Reading Courses: These are the two State required Diagnostic Reading courses (either Elementary or Secondary) that are required for a Professional Teaching Certificate. Each course is 3 cr. It is generally offered every 8 weeks online, and at the Ann Arbor campus in July.

Next start dates: April 30 – June 22, online

Summer seated course meets 4 days: July 11, 18, 25, Aug 1, at Ann Arbor campus

Master of Science in Educational Leadership (MSEL): This program is designed for professional educators who are seeking the K-12 School Administrator License in Michigan. The nationally accredited School Administrator Master's degree provides a curriculum aligned with the Michigan Standards for the Preparation of Building Administrators and prepare professional educators who are servant leaders, reflective practitioners, and committed to life-long learning (32 credits).

Next start date: April 30, online or at the Ann Arbor campus Saturday mornings

School Administrator Certificate Program (SACP): The Post Master's K-12 School Administrator Certificate Program (SACP) is designed for candidates who already hold a valid education-related master's degree and desire to prepare for a role in K-12 building leadership. Students, having completed the prescribed coursework, can be recommended by CUAA as candidates for the Michigan School Administrator Certificate (23 credits).

Next start date: April 30, online or at the Ann Arbor campus Saturday mornings

Master of Science in Curriculum and Instruction (MSCI): This program is designed for educators who are interested in enhancing their leadership skills, expanding teaching strategies, and becoming master teachers. Courses introduce a systematic approach to instructional design, which will serve as a necessary foundation for developing needs-based curriculum. Start dates vary by track.

Track 1: MSCI with Curriculum and Instruction Concentration (31 credits)

Track 2: MSCI with English as a Second Language Endorsement (30 credits)

Track 3: MSCI with Early Childhood (32 credits)

Master of Science in Special Education Learning Disabilities (includes the Endorsement in Special Education Learning Disabilities): The MS Special Education Learning Disability Master's Degree (36 credits) and Endorsement Program (30 credits) focus on the acquisition of real-world skills for addressing the needs of students with learning disabilities in both the general education and special education setting. The student teaching experience may be completed in current teaching assignment if certain requirements are met.

Next start date: August 27, online

Endorsement in English as a Second Language: The English as a Second Language (ESL) Endorsement is a 21-credit cohort program approved by the Michigan Department of Education. Courses in the program help K-12 teachers understand the linguistic and cultural problems that students have when English is not their native language. ESL teacher training gives teachers tools to deal with these challenges so that students who speak other languages can become more integrated into classroom activities.

Next start date: Varies whether candidate takes the MSCI in conjunction with ESL, or the ESL Endorsement without the curriculum courses. It is offered online and seated when available.
